He coordinates the Confronting Atrocity Project, a transnational study of post-conflict truth and reconciliation processes.

He is also the Project Director of Participedia, a global research network on public participation and democratic innovations.

Bonny serves on the Board of several International human rights and development organizations.

He is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada.
